

Stewardship Message— "Fully Alive as Missionary Disciples"

Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time Is 50.5-9a / Jas 2.14-18 / Mk8:27-35

In today's Gospel we see the awkward scene where Jesus rebukes Peter, saying, "Get behind me Satan. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." This seems harsh because Peter was simply speaking out against something that truly offended and saddened him -he certainly was not trying to play the part of Satan! But how often do we let our fears get in the way of God's plans? How often do we shy away from proper stewardship of our gifts because we don't have faith?? In today's second reading, James says that faith without works "is dead." As missionary disciples, we should strive for a LIV-ING faith that does not doubt or fear, and joyfully cooperate with God's plans and ask for the faith and the courage to do so! "For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it."
