"Who are you Following?"

Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jer 23:1-6 / Eph 2:13-18 / Mk 6:30-34

Sheep. Do you ever wonder why the sheep/shepherd metaphor is used so often in the Bible? They are mentioned multiple times in today's readings. Sheep are strange, defenseless creatures that can't seem to manage to survive without the shepherd. Is this true of humans? Do we tend to blindly follow others into danger? Do we imitate each other's sinful behaviors? Do we choose to pursue one another rather than our Good Shepherd? Sadly, many of us do all of these things. In today's Gospel, Jesus saw this and "his heart was moved with pity for them." Discipleship requires us to recognize these behaviors as faults in our fallen selves. In Baptism, we have been called into humility... to recognize that we NEED The Good Shepherd and to DECIDE then and there to follow only Him. This is what being a faith steward is all about.

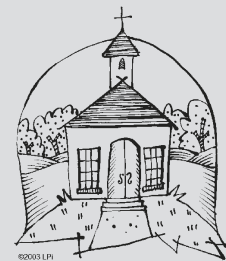
