Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
2 Kgs 4:42-44 / Eph 4:1-6 / Jn 6:1-15

In today's second reading, Paul urges us "to live in a manner worthy of the call you have received." This is Stewardship!!

A faithful steward lives a life that discerns God's plan for our lives and then spending our days using our gifts to fulfill that plan. God can do amazing work with your gift too. GRIEVING WITH GREAT HOPE—BEGINNING SEPT 10

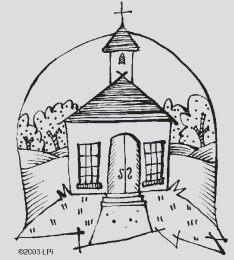
