Stewardship Message—

Just Have Faith

Wis 1:13-15, 2:23-24/ 2 Cor 8:7, 9, 13-15 / Mk 5:21-43

Today's Gospel presents two scenarios which allow Jesus to make one very important point: "Do not be afraid; just have faith." The first scenario depicts Jairus, pleading with Jesus to lay His hands on his dying daughter so that she might be healed. The second scenario describes a hemorrhaging woman who reaches out and touches Jesus' garment, sure of His ability to heal. Both scenarios end with healing because the recipients had faith that Jesus could and would provide. So what about you and I? Most of us would claim that our faith is unshakable, but most of us have never been as desperate as Jairus or the hemorrhaging woman. We have freely given our FIAT, but in times of trial may also need to hear Jesus reminder: "Do not be afraid; just have faith." Whether you need spiritual, emotional, or physical healing, reach out in faith and trust Jesus to provide.

DOCTRINAL SECTION

Let us come to his bride, his mother, his perfect handmaid, for the blessed Mary is all of this. But what are we to do for her? What kind of gifts shall we offer her? Would that we could at least return what we are in duty bound to do, for we owe her honor and service, we owe her love and praise. We owe her honor, for she is the mother of our Lord. He who fails to honor the mother clearly dishonors the son. Also, Scripture says: Honor you father and your mother. What then, my brothers, shall we say? Is she not our mother? Yes, my brothers, she is indeed our mother, for through her we have been born, not for the world but for God. Once we all lay in death, as you know and believe, in sin, in darkness, in misery. In death, because we had lost the Lord; in sin, because of our corruption; in darkness, for we were without the light of wisdom, and thus had perished utterly. But then we were born, far better than through Eve, through Mary the blessed, because Christ was born of her. We have recovered new life in place of sin, immortality instead of mortality, light in place of darkness. She is our mother—the mother of our life, the mother of our incarnation, the mother of our light. As the Apostle says of our Lord, he became for us by God's power our wisdom and justice, and holiness and redemption. She then, as mother of Christ, is the mother of our wisdom and justice, of our holiness and redemption. She is more our mother than the mother of our flesh. Our birth from her is better, for from her is born our holiness, our wisdom, our justice, our sanctification, our redemption.

Just as Jairus overcame his fears in order to encounter Jesus and receive life, so we must surrender our own wills in order to encounter Jesus and receive life. Living the paschal mystery is none other than our daily dying to self—overcoming our fears and reaching out to Jesus in humility—in all the little, practical ways that fill our daily routines. Paschal mystery dying is as simple as smiling at the children even when we're bone tired or taking an hour out of our day to visit the sick. When we surrender in humility to his goodness and power, Jesus offers us life and in this we encounter the Lord of life. (Living Liturgy, p.164)
