Stewardship Message—Open your mind

1 Kgs 19:4-8 / Eph 4:30-5:2 / Jn 6:41-51

The opening verse of today's gospel is troubling: "The Jews murmured about Jesus..." The word murmuring does not imply that the Jews were discussing the merits of Jesus' message. We murmur secrets, lies, and rumors, not compliments. Clearly, the Jews didn't like Jesus or what He had to say. The thing is, we don't get to judge God's messengers. When God chooses to relay a message, we must be alert and listen, even when we don't really care for the messenger. That person might be a meddlesome neighbor, a persnickety family member, an unpopular politician, or a cranky old pastor. It doesn't matter! Each one of those people can be used as an instrument of God, and missing the message because of your disdain for the person could prove to be spiritually fatal! Jesus told the Jews that He was the bread of life — the way to the Father! They resisted that message. They resisted the draw of the Father! Let us learn, then, to be humble, alert, and open-minded as we grow in our ability to disciple and evangelize others, allowing them to do the same for us!

DOCTRINAL SECTION

To accomplish so great a work, Christ is always present in His Church, especially in her liturgical celebrations. He is present in the sacrifice of the Mass, not only in the person of His minister, "the same now offering, through the ministry of priests, who formerly offered himself on the cross", but especially under the Eucharistic species. By His power He is present in the sacraments, so that when a man baptizes it is really Christ Himself who baptizes. He is present in His word, since it is He Himself who speaks when the holy scriptures are read in the Church. He is present, lastly, when the Church prays and sings, for He promised:

"Where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them" (Matt. 18:20).

Christ indeed always associates the Church with Himself in this great work wherein God is perfectly glorified and men are sanctified. The Church is His beloved Bride who calls to her Lord, and through Him offers worship to the Eternal Father. Rightly, then, the liturgy is considered as an exercise of the priestly office of Jesus Christ. In the liturgy the sanctification of the man is signified by signs perceptible to the senses, and is effected in a way which corresponds with each of these signs; in the liturgy the whole public worship is performed by the Mystical Body of Jesus Christ, that is, by the Head and His members.

From this it follows that every liturgical celebration, because it is an action of Christ the priest and of His Body which is the Church, is a sacred action surpassing all others; no other action of the Church can equal its efficacy by the same title and to the same degree.

In the earthly liturgy we take part in a foretaste of that heavenly liturgy which is celebrated in the holy city of Jerusalem toward which we journey as pilgrims, where Christ is sitting at the right hand of God, a minister of the holies and of the true tabernacle; we sing a hymn to the Lord's glory with all the warriors of the heavenly army; venerating the memory of the saints, we hope for some part and fellowship with them; we eagerly await the Saviour, Our Lord Jesus Christ, until He, our life, shall appear and we too will appear with Him in glory.

Nothing will nourish us more than focusing on God's love, of which the cross is the symbol. The love that Jesus reveals through the symbol of the cross is: self-giving, sacrificial, forgiving, healing,

unifying, loyal to one's friends, powerless, in solidarity with the weak, confident in the power of God. As Vincentians, frequent meditation on the cross, as the symbol of God's love for us and of our love of God, has abiding importance. Jesus' dying love gives meaning to the many "crosses" his followers are called to bear. The following of the crucified Lord is the supreme act of faith; it is a surrender in hope and love into the incomprehensible mystery of God. (Maloney, He Hears the Cry of the Poor.)
