## Stewardship Message— Selfless Surrender

Wis 2:12, 17-20 / Jas 3:16-4:3 / Mk 9:30-37

"If anyone wishes to be first, he must be the last of all and the servant of all." What does this mean in terms of our discipleship? It means that our call to discipleship must not become a source of pridefulness. Jesus set the bar high in terms of selfless surrender — it doesn't just mean that you give yourself over to the beautiful parts of God's will. That path will likely include some undesirable moments as well...for Jesus, that meant persecution, rejection, and crucifixion. In today's Gospel, Jesus tells the disciples that He will be put to death, and the next thing He knows, they are arguing over who is the greatest among them. Isn't that just like humans?! Authentic discipleship is not described by greatness, privilege, or self-glorification. Instead, it is characterized by humility, meekness, lowliness, and servanthood. John the Baptist tells us that if God is to grow in us, we must diminish (Jn 3:30). This is echoed in Jesus' message today. Allow your discipleship to be great — to glorify God and build up His Kingdom, but do so quietly and by serving those who are most often overlooked.

## DOCTRINAL SECTION

The Roman Missal, promulgated in 1570 by Our predecessor, St. Pius V, by decree of the Council of Trent, has been received by all as one of the numerous and admirable fruits which the holy Council has spread throughout the entire Church of Christ. For four centuries, not only has it furnished the priests of the Latin Rite with the norms for the celebration of the Eucharistic Sacrifice, but also the saintly heralds of the Gospel have carried it almost to the entire world. Furthermore, innumerable holy men have abundantly nourished their piety towards God by its readings from Sacred Scripture or by its prayers, whose general arrangement goes back, in essence, to St. Gregory the Great. The Second Vatican Ecumenical Council, in promulgating the Constitution Sacrosanctum Concilium, established the basis for the general revision of the Roman Missal: in declaring "both texts and rites should be drawn up so that they express more clearly the holy things which they signify"; in ordering that "the rite of the Mass is to be revised in such a way that the intrinsic nature and purpose of its several parts, as also the connection between them, can be more clearly manifested, and that devout and active participation by the faithful can be more easily accomplished"; in prescribing that "the treasures of the Bible are to be opened up more lavishly, so that richer fare may be provided for the faithful at the table of God's Word"; in ordering, finally, that "a new rite for concelebration is to be drawn up and incorporated into the Pontifical and into the Roman Missal.

Are we alert, "listening," to the "signs of the times": the increasing gap between the rich and the poor and the repeated call for justice made by the Church?
