Stewardship Message – Be Not Afraid

Is 6:1-2a, 3-8 / 1 Cor 15:1-11 / Lk 5:1-11

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells Simon to "Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch." Perhaps a bit cranky and exhausted after having already fished all night with nothing to show for his labors, Simon suggests to Our Lord that doing as he says would simply be a waste of time. At this particular point in time, Simon, or Peter, was at a bit of a disadvantage compared to us, for he didn't yet fully know that Jesus was also God. Like Peter, we are also often asked by Jesus to perform tasks that we might be reluctant to perform; we might even be so bold as to think we know the better way. But the reassuring words that Jesus spoke to Peter, "Do not be afraid," are meant for us today, also. Let us not be afraid to cast our nets or to put out into deep water when we, too, are called by the Lord.

DOCTRINAL SECTION

Christ's passover includes not only his passion and death, but also his resurrection. This is recalled by the assembly's acclamation following the consecration: "*We proclaim your resurrection*". The Eucharistic Sacrifice makes present not only the mystery of the Saviour's passion and death, but also the mystery of the resurrection which crowned his sacrifice. It is as the living and risen One that Christ can become in the Eucharist the "bread of life", the "living bread". Saint Ambrose reminded the newly-initiated that the Eucharist applies the event of the resurrection to their lives: "Today Christ is yours, yet each day he rises again for you". Saint Cyril of Alexandria also makes clear that sharing in the sacred mysteries "is a true confession and a remembrance that the Lord died and returned to life for us and on our behalf". The sacramental representation of Christ's sacrifice, crowned by the resurrection, in the Mass involves a most special presence which – in the words of Paul VI – "is called 'real' not as a way of excluding all other types of presence as if they were 'not real', but because it is a presence in the fullest sense: a substantial presence whereby Christ, the God-Man, is wholly and entirely present". This sets forth once more the perennially valid teaching of the Council of Trent: "the consecration of the bread and wine effects the change of the whole substance of the bread into the substance of the body of Christ our Lord, and of the whole substance of the wine into the substance of his blood. And the holy Catholic Church has fittingly and properly called this change transubstantiation". Truly the Eucharist is a *mysterium fidei*, a mystery which surpasses our understanding and can only be received in faith, as is often brought out in the catechesis of the Church Fathers regarding this divine sacrament: "Do not see – Saint Cyril of Jerusalem exhorts – in the bread and wine merely natural elements, because the Lord has expressly said that they are his body and his blood: faith assures you of this, though your senses suggest otherwise". *Adoro te devote, latens Deitas*, we shall continue to sing with the Angelic Doctor. Before this mystery of love, human reason fully experiences its limitations. One understands how, down the centuries, this truth has stimulated theology to strive to understand it ever more deeply.
